SCHMILE A MILWAUKEE HISTORY LESSON

This article was in the Milwaukee Sentinel August 13, 1878 and republished in *The Making of Milwaukee*, John Gurda, copyright the Milwaukee Historical Society, Chapter 4 page 145.

"NO a citizen of Milwaukee possessing a nose to smell or a stomach to endure, but is already prepared to unanimously denounce the filthy, villainous, unhealthy, plague-breeding condition of the river. In its palmyest days, the Chicago River which has been for years the scorn of vain-glorious Milwaukee, could never boast of a fouler collection of the seeds of death than now floats upon the odorous tide that passes through the heart of this city. In a day when the east wind prevents the sluggish current from setting outward, as was the case yesterday, life in the vicinity of East and West Water Streets is simply unendurable.

It is a narrow, tortuous stream, hemmed in by the unsightly rear ends of street buildings and all sorts of waste places; it is a currentless and yellowish murky stream with water like oil, and an odor combined of the effluvia of a hundred sewers. Nothing could better illustrate the contaminations of city life than the terrible change its waters undergo in a mile from their sparkling and rural cleanliness, up above, into this vile and noxious compound here among the wharves."
