MBC MINUTES FROM OCTOBER 20, 2011

Commodore Wayne Happel called the meeting to order at 6:55 pm.

First order of business was for Wayne to report on Dave Dorner after undergoing six bypasses. His rehab is going well, and he reports that he's getting tired of reading a book ten hours a day. He was told he did not have to do the Purser's report until he's better but defied the Commodore's order and got it done anyway. Such dedication!

The minutes for the April meeting were approved by the members as printed in the May Runabout. Wayne reported the Runabout editor gave him credit for the article on the picnic which was actually written by Connie.

The Commodore said he would not call for a board meeting as he did not have any urgent issues and we did not have a quorum.

Senior Pilot Jim Hayden with assistance from Connie reported the Commodore's Ball will be held December 3rd at their Hotel, The Radisson Inn, Menomonee Falls.

In the absence of the Purser, Yeoperson Lynne Happel reported an April 21 starting balance of \$2,932.44, income 4-21 thru 10-19 of \$1,635.00, expenses 4-21 thru 10-19 of \$2,975.16 with a balance of \$1,592.28.

Wayne read a report from Dave, which noted our balance for the period 10-19-09 to 10-20-10 was -\$426.48 and for our current period 10-20-10 to 10-19-11 it was -\$620.60 which is tracking fairly close.

Dan Danowski suggested that we should change collection of dues from December to September, which then would make this number a positive. A member suggested we should have an annual budget and audit.

Wayne noted Russ Berg's suggestion we purchase drink holder cozies' with our club name and website to promote the club through member distribution.

House & equipment Director Tom McElwee suggested we buy a Nesco cooker that can be used for various dinners at the club. One member said we should continue borrowing a cooker while another said perhaps a member would donate one. Wayne will add all of the above suggestions for the board to consider.

Bonnie asks everyone to get dues to her no later than December 31st.

Program Director Dave Schneckenberg reported he will have a guest speaker from The National Weather Service at the November meeting.

Wayne, reporting for LMYA, said they are forming a committee to lobby Madison to allow non-ethanol fuel at boat fuel docks in Wisconsin.

The membership approved a bylaw change that will allow the Purser to pay bills without board approval up to \$500. The former amount was \$50.

Dan Danowski asked that the board consider refreshing the club room with a new coat of paint and carpeting. He talked with Harborside management, which is supportive of the idea and now is waiting to hear from the Coast Guard Auxiliary, which also uses this room. Dan suggests the cost be split 3 ways, which would make our share approximately \$800. Wayne thought we should also consider a 220 volt line to the room, so we can get some space heaters connected.

It was reported that Bernie Larson's procedure for placement of a stent went well and he is doing fine.

AHOY, MATEY! IT'S TIME TO PAY YOUR 2012 DUES!

The MBC bylaws state, all dues are payable on or before December 1st of each year.
